Can you answer the questions posted at four of the entrances below? In order to find the exits, you will need to walk straight down from the entrances, make turns whenever you came across horizontal lines, then walk straight down again! Try now and you will find the correct exits.

Entrance A



"Girls are the only victims of child sexual abuse." Is this true?



Entrance B



Do you think people who commit child sexual abuse are strangers to victims?



Entrance C



Do you think all child abusers are males who use violence?



Entrance D



Do you think you should keep it secret if sexual abuse occurs to you?



If sexual abuse happens, you should shake your head, speak up and say "No, stop it!" Then make sure you are safe and leave the place. You should never keep it secret, do tell an adult whom you trust! Can you name a person whom you trust?

No! Sexual abusers can be both males and females, but males usually proportioned the larger numbers. Child abusers may not necessarily use violence; bribery, friendship and sympathy are the most common and effective tools of the abusers.



Child abusers may not be strangers of victims. In some cases, abusers can be someone whom they know. However, there are only few adults who commit sexual abuse. Don't lose your trusts to all of them!

No! Boys are equally at risk of being sexually abused. Basically everyone can be the prey of abusers regardless of age and gender. Therefore, be alert and protect yourself!
